Summary of Module

This module will enable candidates to identify the essential elements of the legal system, including the main sources of law, recognise and apply the appropriate legal rules relating to the contract law and negligence and explain and apply the law relating to employment relationships. Students will also learn the main features of data protection legislation and intellectual property and study the law of agency and apply ethical guidance in the context of business law.

Students will learn to distinguish between alternative forms and constitutions of business organisations and recognise and compare types of capital and the financing of companies.

In addition, students will learn how companies are managed, administered and regulated and recognise the legal implications relating to insolvency law. As part of the module, students will demonstrate an understanding of corporate fraudulent and criminal behaviour, including legislation relating to money laundering, fraud and bribery.
