Summary of Module This module allows students the opportunity to explore, in depth, one contemporary issue in the law. The module will be delivered in one day conference format whereby each member of the law staff will deliver a presentation on a current issue in law. It is anticipated that the presentations will change each year based on staff members' research and teaching expertise and contemporary debates in law but may include areas such as medical law, internet law, corporate law, public law, family law and human rights. Students then choose which topic they wish to explore in more depth and produce one piece of written work on the topic of their choice. The written work will be 4000 words in length.
