Summary of Module			
This module seeks to explore advanced techniques in live ensemble performance. The module will provide students with the necessary skills to prepare, rehearse and evaluate a live ensemble performance to a professional level. Students will identify and prepare repertoire for a live ensemble performance. Preparation and repertoire progress will be identified and analysed within an appropriate rehearsal journal. Students will evaluate progress as the agreed repertoire develops and then perform the set within a professional setting, whilst implementing key concepts and techniques of live performance. Students will also identify and deploy stagecraft techniques appropriate to the chosen repertoire within the performance.
