Summary of Module

In this module, students will identify ethical dilemmas and understand the importance of making ethical and moral judgements and behaving appropriately. Students will apply professional scepticism, navigate complex ethical and moral situations, and understand the importance of making ethical decisions that are in the public interest and that resonate with the common good, thereby contributing positively to society. This module will also consider traditional and emerging accounting practices in a way that supports the transition towards a more sustainable and fairer world as envisaged by extant national and global standards on sustainability and sustainable development, such as the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and UN Principles of Responsible Management Education (PRME). The module will develop critical and transferable skills and have an ethical orientation, recognising the urgency and extent of sustainability challenges to society and the planet and reflecting potential impact on, and risks for, diverse stakeholders.
