Summary of Module

This module examines the business case, models, and practices for sustainable business development. Students will critically analyse the rationale and imperatives for companies to adopt more sustainable strategies, as well as assess different frameworks and options they have for deploying sustainability across their operations and value chains.

Students will analyse and evaluate contemporary organisations to determine appropriate sustainable pathways for those organisations. This will include an assessment of current industry practice, business model considerations, value chain influences, and stakeholder obligations that should be considered when determining the most viable sustainability strategies to balance commercial and ethical outcomes.
