Summary of Module			
<p>Contemporary Performance in Context builds on students' knowledge of 20th century cultural movements and progresses their understanding to include movements from the late 20th Century and early 21st Century. The module facilitates student-led investigation into the political, social and material dynamics that produced cultural movements and the performance that emerged from them. These may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Live Art • Postmodernism • Postdramatic performance <p>Through short interactive lectures, subject specific tutorials and VLE activity in which students are introduced to practitioners and cultural outputs, students will analyse the contexts in which the works were created and consumed and consider their legacy.</p>
