Summary of Module

This module will provide students who are complete beginners in German with an introduction to the language and some basic communication skills. It will equip students with linguistic "survival skills" such as making contact, introducing themselves, exchanging general personal information and observing general standards of politeness. The following lexical and grammar items will be covered: regular and irregular verbs in the present tense, definite and indefinite articles, personal, demonstrative, indefinite pronouns in adjectival form, predicative adjectives, numerals, simple sentence structure, questions, negation. Students will acquire oral language skills through guided interactive oral exercises in class, supported through independent listening and reading exercises. Reading and writing skills will be acquired through guided exercises in class, supported by independent reading and writing work. Learning will also be supported by the use on-line learning environments. The mode of delivery will normally be over 12 weeks, 2 hours a week.
