Summary of Module

This module contributes to helping students prepare for assessed practice by introducing them to key aspects of policy and legislation in Scotland, which underpin contemporary social work practice.

The module covers contemporary policy and legislation relevant to social work practice in Scotland, specifically the fields of community care, justice and children and families social work. Human rights are also explored.

Practical applications throughout the module illustrate the ethical dimensions of applying policy and legislation.

The module will be delivered in a hybrid mode with a combination of synchronous / live online learning opportunities including learning materials, resources and learning activities through a virtual learning environment. Students will be expected to draw from their current practice and use examples within all learning activities, including summative assessment.
