# **Summary of Module**

This module will develop knowledge and understanding to support the student dental nurse to engage in the prevention of caries and periodontal disease and assist the practitioner during the restoration of the dentition using non-advanced techniques.

The student will be required to have knowledge and understanding of the medicaments and techniques used to prevent dental caries and periodontal disease. This will include topical fluoride, effective use of oral hygiene aids and fissure sealants. Students will utilise evidence-based practice as they identify factors which influence an individual's health-related behaviours and use this knowledge to promote oral health. The student will examine the aetiology, pathology, progression and presentation of common oral diseases and the current concepts of oral and general health and its determinants. An appreciation of the risk factors which influence an individual's oral health will also be examined.

The student is required to develop knowledge and application of skills in relation to a range of materials used to restore the dentition. This will include the equipment, medicaments and techniques used in conservative dentistry. The student nurse will manage and prepare the patient for dental procedures and manage the aftercare.
