Summary of Module

This Paramedic learner module introduces the student to practice education in a variety of clinical settings. This is achieved through a series of introductory lectures, tutorials and workshops and through interaction with guest speakers and service users. The module lays the foundation for the development of a professional identity as a Paramedic Learner and reinforces the value of reflection and experiential learning. The module incudes up to 160 hours ambulance and cross-sector practice-based education experiences, and supports the student to develop the knowledge, skills and understanding required of a Paramedic, and begin their development towards achieve the HCPC Standards of Proficiency. Practice-Based Education experiences will be with the Scottish Ambulance Service and partner organisations throughout Lanarkshire, Ayrshire & Arran, or Dumfries & Galloway.

Learners will be involved in the evaluation of placements and case-based reflection upon their practice through the development of their learning contracts with practice educators.
