Summary of Module

This paramedic learner module continues the development of the student in practice education in a variety of clinical settings. Learners will work alongside experienced practice educators and will be actively involved in a variety of aspects of patient care, demonstrating their knowledge and experience as they work towards achieving the standards of proficiency for paramedics. Learners will have the opportunity to demonstrate their communication, decision making and leadership abilities whilst refining their patient assessment and clinical skills in a supportive environment.

In these practice based education experiences, learners will work under direction to demonstrate the beginning of their learning towards becoming a responsible, independently registered healthcare professional, delivering safe, effective patient-centered care.

This module includes up to 400 hours ambulance and cross-sector based education experiences and supports the student to develop the knowledge, skills and understanding required of a paramedic. practise based educational experiences would not be within the Scottish ambulance service, NHS Lanarkshire, NHS Ayrshire & Arran and NHS Dumfries & Galloway.

Learning and Teaching
