Summary of Module

The General Dental Council's (GDC) Scope of Practice has increased and expanded the legislative range of duties that a dental nurse can perform. This change has resulted in the dental nurse enhancing their role by being more involved with client care; this extends from supporting planned treatment to supporting the management and prevention of oral disease including those with special needs.

This module is designed to develop the additional skills, knowledge, and expertise of GDC registered dental nurses to enable them to demonstrate initiative and independence as they apply a range of prescribed practical skills and techniques.

Patient safety, quality assurance and competence are the overarching principles of the GDC. Student skills will be further developed by engaging with simulated learning experiences. This module is critical to the delivery of safe, client centred, evidence- based care.
